- 11 February 1945 - Commander Air Force, Pacific Fleet, Subordinate Command Forward Area assumed type command of the NAVAL AIR BASE vice Commander Naval Air Bases, Guam.
- 28 February 1945 - Additional taxiway with eighteen hardstands on southern taxi loop was completed, having been under construction since 12 February. These were required due to arrival of an additional PB4Y squadron.
- 5 March 1945 - VPB 150 relieved by VPB 133 and returned to the states.
- 7 March 1945 - Explosion from unknown cause at Mine Assembly Depot #4, injured five (5) men attached to the depot and killed twelve (12) men attached to Army units.
- 11 March 1945 - Mr. Charles THOMAS, Special Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of the Navy visited the Base to discuss welfare, recreation and morale problems.
- 4 April 1945 - First Echelon of VPB 108 arrived.
- 5 April 1945 - VPB 116 moved to Palaus.
- 13 April 1945 - Mobile Training Unit #3 reported aboard. Word was received that our president, Franklin D. Roosevelt, had died.
- A PB4Y-2, piloted by Lieutenant Commander FARWELL of VPB 118, returning from patrol, ran out of gas and was forced to ditch two (2) miles west of NAVAL AIR BASE strip. All members of the crew were rescued in good condition twenty (20) minutes after ditching.
- 15 April 1945 - Memorial services were held for Franklin D. Roosevelt.
- 17 April 1945 - VPB 116 returned from Palau.
- 19 April 1945 - VPB 102 moved to Palau.
- 20 April 1945 - NAVAL AIR BASE strip closed for temporary resurfacing and repairs. Adjacent VLR strips being temporarily used for NAVAL AIR BASE operations.
- 22 April 1945 - VPB 118 commenced its forward movement to Okinawa. A B-29 returning from a mission experienced failure of the right aileron control cable while landing and crashed in the NAVAL AIR BASE operations area. The B-29 and a PB4Y-2 were destroyed and two PB4Y-2's were damaged. ILLING, Harold I., ARMLc of CASU(F)-44, did heroic rescue work and was recommended for award of the Navy and Marine Corp Medal, which he later received.
