23 April 1945 - Vice Admiral John TOWERS, Deputy Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet and Pacific Ocean Areas, visited the Base.

30 April 1945 - VPB 102 returned from Palau.

Due to the necessity of PB4Y's taking off heavily over-loaded, a request was submitted to the Island Commander to increase the length of the NAVAL AIR BASE strip to seven thousand (7,000) feet. The request was turned down as equipment required was said to be more vitally needed by VLR strips under construction.

5 May 1945 - VPB 106 commenced forward movement to Philippines.

9 May 1945 - VPB 109 commenced forward movement to Okinawa.

Special strike by PB4Y-2's on Marcus Island. Lieutenant Commander MULDRON, Commanding Officer of VPB 108, was shot down over target. He and two of his crew members are missing.

21 May 1945 - Rear Admiral M. R. GREER, Commander Fleet Air Wing EIGHTEEN, established his headquarters on this Base.

The Base Operations and Field Operations Departments of the NAVAL AIR BASE were consolidated.

26 May 1945 - VPB 123 reported aboard for staging through to Okinawa.

31 May 1945 - VPB 109 returned from Okinawa.

The Daily Strength Report this date showed that there were five hundred forty-five (545) officers and three thousand, three hundred thirty-one (3,331) enlisted men on this base, a total of three thousand, eight hundred seventy-six (3,876) persons.
