The Personnel Officer of CASU(F)-44, Lieutenant Elmer Clinton Fansett, (S), USNR, was born on 6 June 1906 at Ansonia, Conn. He is a graduate of Lincoln High School, Portland, Oregon, class of 1924 and was graduated from the University of Oregon with a B.S. degree in 1928. From there he went to Harvard Business School, from which he graduated with an M.B.A. degree in 1931.

For two (2) years thereafter, Lieutenant Fansett was a Department Store Buyer for Olds and King's Department Store, Portland, Oregon. In 1933, he became Comptroller of Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon, and at the same time was Head of the Business and Economics Department. In 1936, he left Pacific University to become the Alumni Director and Field Representative for the Placement Departments and Associated Students of the University of Oregon.

Lieutenant Fansett entered the Navy on 5 Jan. 1943, and was sent to Naval Air Station, Jacksonville, Florida, for indoctrination until the end of that month, at which time he attended the Aviation Officers' Ordnance and Gunnery School at Jacksonville until 27 March. From then until 9 April 1943 he attended the Aerial Mines School at Yorktown, Va., until 15 May 1943.

On 27 May 1943, Lieutenant Fansett reported to CASU-7 at Sand Point, Seattle, and until Feb. 1944 he performed personnel, legal, educational, intelligence, secretary and welfare work.

On 22 Feb. 1944, he was detached to join CASU-44 and has been with the unit since that time as Personnel Officer.

Lieutenant Fansett has performed the duties of Personnel Officer in an outstanding fashion. His background and personality well qualify him for handling his duty with the large turnover of personnel which the unit has experienced. He has consistently maintained the Personnel Division in a state of maximum efficiency. He combines a sympathetic attitude toward enlisted personnel with a firm manner
